Summary Page "Wisdom for Moms of All Ages" The transference of wisdom to youth/naive

Proverbs 1:8 "Listen my son to your father's instruction and do not forsake your mother's teaching." 1) "Listen my son to your father's instruction..."an instructional speech by Solomon to his son as he goes out into the world." Meant for all parents for responsible instruction in life.

2) "and do not forsake your mother's teaching." The mother is also depicted as a teacher. This instruction on teaching the youth as they encounter the culture, is a warning against sinful people, who draw youth and naïve people into making decisions dishonoring self and God.

Reading: Proverbs DJB p803-804 What Proverbs says; What It Means; What It Means For You Proverbs 29:15 "The rod of correction imparts wisdom, but a child left undisciplined disgraces its mother."

Proverbs 3:11-12 "Do not despise the LORD's discipline, and do not resent his rebuke, because the Lord <u>disciplines</u> those he <u>loves</u>; as a father the son he delights in." Through times of testing and affliction, God is teaching the righteous. Discipline primarily involves teaching or training rather than punishment for wrongdoing, that life-threatening, damaging mistakes are not made Proverbs 22:6 "Train a child in the way they should go and when they are old they will not turn from it" When children from Christian homes go astray, their parents often carry a load of guilt and self-recrimination: What should I have done differently" Where could I have done better? But each person is responsible before God for his or her actions—our adult children included. Proverbs 31:27 "She watches over the affairs of her household and does not eat the bread of idleness." She reaches out with her hands to work, help the poor, and provide for her family. 1Kings 3:28 "When all Israel heard the verdict the king had given, they held the king in awe, because they saw that he had wisdom from God to administer justice." (1Kings 31:16-28) Solomon solved the dispute by appealing to maternal instincts and human compassion, knowing the real mother would rather give her child to another than watch him die. This proved to the people that wisdom from God was on Solomon; a supernaturally supplied gift. Psalms 127:3 "Children are a heritage from the LORD, offspring a reward from him." A gift to us. Word Study:

- 1. Affection: devotion, love, fondness, attachment. She has great affection.
- 2. Challenge: a call to special effort, difficulty in achieving, a contest Raising children is always a challenge for parents.
- 3. Disposition: the natural mental/emotional mood, characteristic attitude Her disposition was one of joy and peace in the Lord.
- 4. Guilt: the feeling of responsibility for behavior or action, real or imagined A mom often feels when things don't go well she is responsible.
- 5. Individuals: a single person, independent of a group or others Her attitude was very different from her school age culture.
- 6. Qualities: the character or nature of someone that makes them unique She had qualities of love, patience, a caring attitude and helpfulness.
- 7. Sacrificial: To sacrifice, give up something of great value for something of greater value. Mom's often have a sacrificial attitude for their families.

I want to begin by saying what I am not. I am not a child psychologist, a trained counselor or therapist. I am a Christian mother and grandmother. I have raised 3 grown daughters and helped to raise 5 stepdaughters from a very young age. Like many of you I'm also a daughter, sister, aunt and friend to others.

Additionally, I have been a professional teacher, school administrator and Associate School Psychologist for the Dallas County Superintendant's Office. I was not perfect in any of these roles that I served in. But I can say I tried to give my best in each one of them. Some days and some situations were more successful than others. Some, not so good! But today we are going to learn how to be God's best in His wisdom as a mom for all season's in life.

We usually think of being a parent as being biological or adopted. But if you do or do not have children, apply the parts of this lesson to women whom you influence in your life. This is spiritual parenting. Hopefully we all have spiritual daughters' in the faith.

Parenting is difficult because children come in many different sizes, shapes, ages and **dispositions.** And no, they don't come with instructions! Mostly we learn our parenting skills by trial and error. Or, as my mom used to say "by the seat of your pants". But Proverbs gives us a look into godly ways to parent. We get suggestions and real life instructions on how to raise our children. We'll receive information on ways to instruct, discipline and raise faithful children.

Nowhere does Proverbs tell us parenting is easy. It is hard work. In Proverbs 4:1-9 a father is passing wisdom to his son. But he tells the son he got this wisdom from his father when he was a young boy. A commentator named Kidner explains it as bringing three generations together to show how a love of the best things will be given mostly by parents and grandparents through **affection** to the next generation.

We are to give God's wisdom for the best in life to the next generation in affection. We are to love our children but we are also to show them a lot of affection. Say to your child over and over "Do you know how much I love you?" Do this over and over. Why? Because when things get difficult in the "terrible two's" and the teen years having built a foundation of love is going to count for a lot! Be real about it!

The more you do it the better you get at doing it. Pray for a good disposition. We can't be happy all the time but pray for a happy heart with a smiley face on it! One that keeps focused on the fact that children are a blessing from the Lord. They are a gift and not a possession. Psalm 127:3-5. The goal of discipline is change behavior

Our children need to see our faith, love and appreciation for the Lord. Don't just talk about it, show it to them every day and in every way you can. Proverbs 3:1-4 Children learn what they experience. Share your experiences with them so they will learn to see God in all things. Proverbs 22:6 Train up a child in the We are raising up individuals and we need to respect them as **individuals**, but not give in to their self-will. Proverbs 3:11-12. And who needs the fruit of the Spirit more than a mom? Galatians 5:22-23 WE ARE to be FILLED WITH THE SPIRIT Proverbs 31:27. "She watches over the affairs of her household.." We are in a battle for our families in both the heavenly and on the earth. We must fight for our children in what is right and best for them. Keep your eyes open to what is happening in your household. Many women think:

- If I don't look at it then I don't have to deal with it. Be courageous.
- Be careful what you tell them about what you may have done before you married. That information can hang them early in their life.
- Kids act like they are not listening, but they are. Watch what you say/do.
- If you have a gut feeling something isn't true or isn't right, deal with it!
- If you have a strong willed child, you must be stronger!
- You have the money, roof over their head, car keys; you have the power.
- When answers aren't enough turn to "because I said so".
- Her teacher says she marches to a different drummer; fairytale, tailspin,
- Give your child room to mess up—discipline to teach, train, instruct, but never in a time of anger. If need be get a godly counselor for help.
- If they obey God bless them. If they disobey teach them what NO means.
